Over the years with help from Federal, State and private funding we have provided financial assistance across the State creating new housing, addressing rural water issues, housing stability funding for renters and home repair grants for homeowners.

Our Mission: Creating, educating and supporting rural low-income households to become self sufficient.

What is the cost?


All of our services are FREE of charge to those who request and receive them.

In 2024 we provided a wide variety of services which assist individuals and families that are low to moderate income with essential one time financial assistance.



HUD COUNSELING

Employees at Foundation for Rural Housing are HUD Certified Counselors. We are able to provide households in all counties with answers the may need to buy, keep and fix their homes.



HOUSING ASSISTANCE

Serving 69 counties with one time critical housing assistance for security deposit, delinquent rent, utilities, mortgage and property tax assistance.



HOME REPAIR GRANTS

Funds helped do small emergency home repairs for veterans, persons with disability and moderate income households across the State.



Nonprofit Access Grant to provide one-time financial assistance to rural low to moderate income for delinquent telecommunication assistance. Services provided to ___ Households in 2024.



The WHH program was offered to homeowners who were impacted by COVID 19. The program offered Wisconsin Residents with financial assistance due to overdue bills, mortgage, property taxes and more. We provided case management and HUD counseling in 9 counties.



Started in 2024 from Roots & Wings private donation. RDDD address rural household needs for diapers and supplies for low and moderate income families. At the end of 2024 FRH wrote with WISCAP and secured a 2 year \$1.5 million demonstration grant to expand services in Rural Wisconsin, offering diapers to over half of our State including Migrant Farm workers and Tribal partners.




